



Father R. Perin 2017-18 school year results Highlights

- ★ There was an increase in the number of students achieving acceptable standards on Provincial exams in grade 6
- ★ 86% of grades 4-6 students in a survey said they were treated fairly by adults in school
- ★ There was an increase in the percentage of students reporting that they feel safe at school (from 55% to 79%)
- ★ Almost 78% of students reported that they were satisfied with their overall quality of education
- ★ There was a 25% increase in the number of students reporting that they have access to programs and services they need
