School Education Plan Update

Priority 1: Connections Supporting Reconciliation


In each year of this plan, Northland School Division students and staff members will increase and strengthen visible connections to land, Indigenous languages, school communities and collaborative partnerships.


- Outcome 1: Student learning and well-being are rooted in connections to the land, Indigenous languages, and the greater school community.
- Outcome 2: Students are able to access language and cultural learning supporting their well-being.
- Outcome 3: Students have multiple pathways to high school completion including those made available through collaborative partnerships.

How is Father R Perin achieving these outcomes? (See example below)

Cultural Mentorship

Grade 9 students had the opportunity to attend the Alberta Indigenous Mentorship Summit in Edmonton this year. Indigenous Mentors spoke to students, educators and peer mentors about the benefits that mentorship had in their communities, with their youth and on their own lives. Elder's shared their stories and a group of students were chosen for a Youth Panel.

On the Land

Grade 4 and 5, and grades 6 and 7 students had several opportunities to navigate the grounds around the school with their teachers. They learned about various plants and trees, collected samples and discussed what they were observing. Grade 4 and 5 students also created art from the leaves they collected on their walks.

Career Fair

Grade 8 and 9 students were invited out to the Career Fair in Anzac where they learned about a variety of career options available to them.



Priority 2: Holistic Learning

In each year of this plan, each child enrolled in a Northland school will demonstrate excellent literacy and numeracy skills as well as a solid foundation in social-emotional skills.

- · Outcome 1: Students are supported to experience improved achievement and well-being.

Spirit Day and School Teams

Students are making great progress with our Spirit Day participation and school teams activities. These are both programs that are in place to encourage positive behaviours and positive peer interaction. This months winning team with 457 points was Team Wolf! Students earn points through good attendance, participating in class, completing work, positive peer interaction, teamwork and other positive actions.



Literacy and Numeracy

Students have been using their morning classes to focus on their Literacy and Numeracy skills! These young men went the extra mile and completed even the unassigned questions.



Principals will be in touch with the nominees to confirm attendance at the school for the Zoom session, where lunch will be provided. Following the Zoom meeting, the first in-person council meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, December 4, 2024**, at the DoubleTree West Edmonton.

Northland School Division is currently seeking a full-time Family Wellness Worker to join our dedicated teams at Father R. Perin School and Conklin Community School. Father R. Perin School serves students from kindergarten to grade 9 and is located in the community of Janvier, Alberta, approximately 120 kilometers from Fort McMurray. Conklin Community School, also a kindergarten to grade 9 school, is located in the hamlet of Conklin, the southernmost community in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. Conklin is a quiet, rural community situated on the scenic shores of Christina Lake, about 155 kilometers southeast of Fort McMurray, accessible via Alberta Highways 63 and 881.

The Family Wellness Worker will report to the Director of Student Services and follow the central office's 12-month calendar. To learn more about what Northland School Division has to offer, please visit www.nsd61.ca/careers.

Major Responsibilities include:

- Provide intervention and/or support services to students and families who may be at risk or currently facing social, emotional, behavioral or family challenges
- Promote effective communication and parenting skills
- Build skills with the students individually and in small groups
- Assist in finding information and resources such as counseling after hour crisis response workers
- Advocate within the school and the community
- Promote preventative opportunities within the schools and community
- Collaborate with community agencies

Qualifications include:

- Degree in Social Work.
- Valid driver's license

The vision of the program is to provide free confidential intervention services to students and families in order to support their emotional, behavioral and social wellbeing. The salary for this position is based on qualifications and experience. A comprehensive benefit package is also provided.


